

### **Parking for Major Downtown Venues**

#### An die Musik

Park at Franklin Street Garage (corner of Charles & Franklin Streets) less than a block away. Parking is discounted but you must pick up a voucher at An die Musik to receive discounted rate.

### **Center Stage**

Parking is available at the Baltimore Sun parking garage at 601 N. Calvert St. diagonally across from the theatre at Calvert and Monument streets.

### **Chesapeake Shakespeare Company**

\$5 parking is available at Arrow parking 1 block south of the theater on Water Street. Entrances are on both Lombard and Water streets. Obtain a \$5 parking voucher from Chesapeake Shakespeare usher the day of the performance.

### **Everyman Theatre**

The Atrium Parking Garage is attended and is across the street from the theatre with entrances on Fayette and on Eutaw. There is also parking at 213 W. Fayette St. a block away.

#### **Fells Point Corner Theatre**

There is free parking on Broadway Street after 6pm and all day on Sunday. Some street parking is available near the theatre on S. Ann, Gough, and S. Regester Streets.

### **Peabody Institute**

Peabody Garage is at 606 Saint Paul Street and is open until 9:30 p.m. weekdays and 5:30 p.m. weekends.

### **Spotlighters Theatre**

Parking is on-street and usually available within a 2 or 3 block radius. Parking lots are located one block west of the theatre at Read and Madison streets, and a parking garage is 3 blocks south of the theatre at Calvert and Centre streets.

### **Theatre Project**

The closest parking garage is across the corner at Cathedral and Preston (other venues also use this). There is a garage at 1030 Park Ave. (official parking for the BSO) several blocks away. The Fitzgerald Parking Garage is 2-1/2 blocks away at the corner of Mt. Royal and Oliver Streets.

### **Vagabond Theatre**

The Vagabond recommends the Caroline Street Garage on Caroline and Lancaster streets several blocks away.

### **Towson University**

Many streets around campus are under construction. Please allow extra travel time. New buildings are under construction on the campus, so please stay on designated walkways. Drop off is allowed. For construction updates and traffic impacts, visit towson.edu/construction.
