

Years before Dorothy and her dog crash-land, another little girl makes her presence known in Oz. This girl, Elphaba, is born with emerald-green skin—no easy burden in a land as mean and poor as Oz, where superstition and magic are not strong enough to explain or overcome the natural disasters of flood and famine. Still, Elphaba is smart, and by the time she enters Shiz University, she becomes a member of a charmed circle of Oz's most promising young citizens.

But Elphaba's Oz is no utopia. The Wizard's secret police are everywhere. Animals—those creatures with voices, souls, and minds—are threatened with exile. Young Elphaba, green and wild and misunderstood, is determined to protect the Animals—even if it means combating the mysterious Wizard, even if it means risking her single chance at romance. Ever wiser in guilt and sorrow, she can find herself grateful when the world declares her a witch. And she can even make herself glad for that young girl from Kansas.



Parking for Major Downtown Venues

Baltimore Center Stage

Parking is available at the Baltimore Sun parking garage at 601 N. Calvert St. diagonally across from the theatre at Calvert and Monument streets.

Chesapeake Shakespeare Company

\$10 parking is available at Truist Place Garage, 4 N Calvert St, 1 block north of the theater. Order discounted tickets in advance online at https://promo.parking.com/chesapeake-shakespeare-company-parking/

Everyman Theatre

The Atrium Parking Garage is closed for event parking. The Baltimore Grand Garage is at 5 N. Paca Street, adjacent to the Hippodrome.

Fells Point Corner Theatre

There is free parking on Broadway after 6pm and all day on Sunday. Some street parking is available near the theatre on S. Ann, Gough, and S. Regester Streets.

Peabody Institute

Peabody Garage is at 606 Saint Paul Street and is open until 9:30 p.m. weekdays and 5:30 p.m. weekends.

Spotlighters Theatre

Parking is on-street and usually available within a 2 or 3 block radius. Parking lots are located one block west of the theatre at Read and Madison streets, and a parking garage is 3 blocks south of the theatre at Calvert and Centre streets.

Theatre Project

The Fitzgerald Parking Garage is 2-1/2 blocks away at the corner of Mt. Royal and Oliver Streets.

Vagabond Theatre

The Vagabond recommends the Caroline Street Garage on Caroline and Lancaster streets several blocks away.


